Inaugurating the Jubilee Year in our Parish

Today, we are inaugurating the Jubilee Year 2025 in our parish. The purpose of this simple ritual is to bring more closely to ourselves the reality of the Jubilee Year that has already started. With the inauguration of the Jubilee Year, we want to realise how urgently we need to start working on its programmes which are summed up in the theme: *Pilgrims of Christian Hope*. It is, therefore, a symbolic gesture of welcoming it in our parish on this solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord.

I am inviting every family, liturgical, devotional and service volunteer group to organize activities to mark the Jubilee Year that include local or international pilgrimages. Individuals or a group may organise pilgrimages to the following Jubilee Churches and sites that have been chosen by our Archbishop: St Chad's Cathedral – Shrine of St Chad; St Anne's Church, Caversham – Shrine of Our Lady of Caversham, Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Hednesford – Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes, St Michael's Church, Penn, Wolverhampton – Shrine of Blessed Carlo Acutis, The Immaculate Conception & St Egwin Church – Shrine of Our Lady of Evesham, Harvington Hall, near Kidderminster, Bl. Dominic Barberi Church & St John Henry Newman College, Littlemore, Oxford.

A pilgrim is different from an ordinary tourist; for whereas such tourist is motivated to undertake a journey for satisfying an intellectual curiosity, a pilgrim is motivated by a spiritual and religious conversion to undertake a holy journey as an act of penance, devotion, or deepened self-reflection.

The Jubilee Year serves to reorganise families, individuals, and communities according to God's holy plan; there ought to be visible in actions of mercy, forgiveness, reconciliation, and mutual respect. This means that in the Jubilee Year, as a parish, we would like to see a more cohesive community that reflects our identity as Church, the spirit of Caritas that supports the needy and vulnerable members. It will be a clear mark of the Jubilee conversion if we as pilgrims of hope who worship in this Church will cultivate a deep sense of veneration for the mystery of the Lord's presence and adopt a high discipline of punctuality.

I pray that whatever we do leads to better interactions with one another as pilgrims of Christian hope who will jointly work practically to carry out the work of evangelization to the people of our age.
