TO BE A CHRISTIAN IS BE A PEACE SIGN

'This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee and manifested his glory and his disciples believed in him' (John 2:11). Today, as we celebrate Peace Sunday, we are blessed to have this text in John that narrates Jesus' first miracle when he changed water into wine. It was the first of his signs, which means that we should expect many more signs in that Gospel, much of which has also been named the Book of Signs. The Bible presents marriage as a sign of God's love for his people.

In human life, signs have the power to communicate messages and their meanings and to attract concrete human responses, some of which can have permanent effects. Human life in its different aspects is a constant interaction with signs and symbols. In fact, we are always invited to read the signs of the times to properly contextualise our activities accordingly. A sign can create peace, it can also lead to violence and unfathomable conflict.

When properly interpreted, signs have the power to guide human actions to the right goals and when ignored one may end up in disaster that may include loss of life. That is how seriously we need to take signs. God, our creator, makes use of signs to communicate with us, and because God is far above us in every way, he spontaneously makes use of signs to communicate and carry out his eternal plans. We could dare to say that God's communication with humans is predominantly in the form of signs. This exactly explains the meaning of sacraments.

Traditionally, a sacrament is defined as "an outward and visible sign of inward and spiritual grace". By invisible grace is implied God's mysterious presence and action to bring about salvation and enrichment to our spiritual life. In the Catholic Church, we have the seven sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, the Eucharist, Penance, Anointing of the Sick, Ordination and Matrimony. By our faith, we can see the action of God's saving grace in those sacraments and signs in many others.

Because the Sacrament of Baptism configures us to Jesus Christ, Christians are signs of the risen Jesus Christ in the world bedevilled by conflict, violence and wars. Let us be "peace signs" and as Pope Francis recommends 'set out on the journey of hope ... to surely glimpse the dawn of the greatly desired goal of peace'. Christian, be a peace sign, be sign of hope.
