LISTENING WITH A HEART

This Sunday, the scripture readings reiterate that constant invitation to attentively listen to the Word of God. This is founded on the fundamental teaching of our faith, namely that, out of love, God the creator, of all things visible and invisible, reveals himself in various ways (Hebrews 1:1).



God also reveals his loving face in the inspired words of the sacred Scriptures – the Bible. This explains why the Bible has a prominent place in our doctrines, acts of worship and moral life as Christians. The proclamation of the Word of God is a privileged moment that calls for listening with the heart and entails thorough preparation to receive God's message and the fulfilment of his plans in one's life. The Word of God has power and we have a witness of this in the Bible itself which states: "the Word of God is living and active... it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12).

Pope Francis explains, 'In this way, it speaks to us of the heart as a core that lies hidden beneath all outward appearances, even beneath the superficial thoughts that can lead us astray. The disciples of Emmaus, on their mysterious journey in the company of the risen Christ, experienced a moment of anguish, confusion, despair and disappointment. Yet beyond and in spite of this, something was happening deep within them: "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road?" (Lk 24:32, see Delixit Nos no.4)

Listening with the heart means being in touch with all that concerns one as a person who is mind, soul and body. An attentive listening to the Word of God could easily lead to the spontaneous response we see in Nehemiah 8: 'For all the people wept as they heard the words of the Law'. This is because it highlighted their weaknesses and failures in the face of God's covenantal faithfulness. That is the enriching attitude we need when we prayerfully listen to or read the Word of God, it does not leave one indifferent. 'Oh, that today you will listen to his voice, harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as on that day at Massah in the desert (Psalm 95).
