

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD.

The sense of belonging to a given society or community, is fostered by the existence of a value system which is upheld by all. The dignity and treasures of human life are structured and protected by societal values which promote the wellbeing of everyone in all aspects of their lives, physically, morally and spiritually. However, as Christians, our fundamental goal is to live in holiness. We promised during our Baptism and Confirmation, that we would reject all that which contradicts God's plan for universal goodness and love. The Sacrament of Baptism, therefore, introduces us to a value system of holiness. Jesus introduced this to us by accepting baptism from John the Baptist at the river Jordan. Though sinless, he had to identify with sinners to show the way to eternal salvation. Baptism is a gate way to a life of commitment and holiness. The Church, therefore, rightly teaches that, "The Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gate to life in the Spirit (vitae spirituals ianua), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons and daughters of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church, and made sharers in her mission: Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word" (CCC 1213). Jesus, true man and true God, pointed to the importance of belonging to God's Kingdom through Baptism. We should therefore adhere to our baptismal promises everyday of our lives.

As we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the readings remind us of our own baptismal promises which were to identify with Lord as our Saviour and Redeemer. We are invited to listen to the Gospel of Christ for our life's journey. When Jesus was baptised by John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form as a dove; and a voice came from heaven. You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased' (Lk3:21-22). This was a complete revelation of the presence of the Most Holy Trinity. We are told the heavens opened when Jesus was baptised. It is also another indication that, through the Sacrament of Baptism, the gates of heaven are thrown open to us. This is provided that we adhere to the Christian principles of love, justice, compassion, peace, impartiality, generosity and piety. But when we incline towards the evil impulses of greed, jealousy, dishonesty, gossip, resentment, pride, selfishness, unfaithfulness and immoral acts, then the dignity and sacramental commitment are watered

down. May the Spirit of the Lord be our guide and direction in making daily decisions in life in order to live in holiness. We should always follow what Saint Paul mentioned in today's second reading. "The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age " (Tit2:11-12). May the feast of the Baptism of the Lord renew our baptismal promises to live holier lives, as Pilgrims of hope during this Jubilee Year of 2025. Fr. Pontius Bandua AJ


