`THEY HAVE NO WINE'

The joy of marriage and family life is expressed in all cultures and traditions, including even those communities that are considered to be primitive when judged by modern standards. This is so because marriage, and the resulting family life, is a divinely instituted entity existing for His eternal glory and for the continuity of human race. It is within the family setting that moral, spiritual and social values are passed on to the subsequent generations. As Christians, we need to promote the gifts of family life and guide against the evils that can destroy this divinely instituted unit in life. It is not unheard of today that many families undergo various challenges such as unfaithfulness, disagreements, lack of generosity, resentment, fear, exploitation, violence and even severed relationships. Such situations undermine the sanctity and fundamental values of the family. When faced with such challenges, we need to invite Jesus and Mary into our families. Sometimes the wine of love, respect and forgiveness runs out during our journey of family life. It is then that we need to call upon the Lord to fill our empty pots with his living water of the Spirit.

As we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of ordinary time, the readings remind us to reflect on the mystery of God's love for humanity as depicted by spousal love. The love between a man and a woman in a Catholic marriage is to resemble that love which God has for His creation. This love is infinite and unconditional. The prophet Isaiah mentions this clearly saying, 'For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you' (Is62:5). Today's Gospel confirms God's love for humanity. Jesus performed one of his first miracles at the wedding in Cana, located in Galilee. This was to confirm the dignity and centrality of marriage in the human community. The Lord blessed the relationship in that marriage with the provision of the best wine. It was also pointing to the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. To 'confirm His divine authority, His mother Mary, said, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' Addressing Mary as 'woman' could be interpreted as showing a lack of respect for his mother. However, the deeper meaning was that Mary represents the human race redeemed by her Son. Even at the foot of cross, he said 'Woman this is your son', meaning John. At the same time he was handing the rest of his followers into her maternal care. The Mother of the Lord, continues to intercede for our Church and

families, just as she did at the wedding when the wine of the feast ran out. We need to entrust our families, communities and the world into the loving care of the Lord. We need to read the signs of the time to do better and to fill our vessels with faith, love, patience, peace, justice, mercy, humility and hope. We should not let envy, jealousy, unfaithfulness, fear, anger, disrespect, grudges and pride empty the graceful vessels of life.
