YEAR OF JUBILEE

Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, a holy year which happens every 25 years in the Catholic Church. The Pope describes this year as, 'an opportunity to be renewed in hope' because it is a time for forgiveness and reconciliation, in which people are invited to come back into right relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation.

The theme of the Jubilee Year (which began on Christmas Eve with the opening of the holy door at St Peter's Basilica in the Vatican) is 'Pilgrims of Hope' and every Catholic is invited to rediscover a spirituality of God's creation in which we understand ourselves as "pilgrims on the earth" rather than masters of the world.

You can discover more about the coming Jubilee Year by reading and reflecting upon the 'Pilgrims of Hope' Guidebook which is available at this weekend's masses if you have not already picked one up.

More importantly, there will be a session next Sunday, 12th January, in our church straight after the 10.30 Mass. We hope as many as possible will stay for that. The session will be just one hour.
