Dear Parishioners,

I think we've started getting into the Jubilee Year now. It would be good if we can pray the Jubilee Prayer daily. There are also 'Companion Booklets' available - it says £1.50 but you can have them for £1! There's some good stuff in them. We need to think about a jubilee pilgrimage. The most adventurous option would be to go to Rome, but that might be too big an undertaking. We could go to Walsingham, Lourdes or Fatima - but again, travel isn't easy. We might be better thinking smaller and going up the M6 to Hednesford - the church of Our Lady of Lourdes which has a life-size grotto there, and is a designated Jubilee Year pilgrimage church by our diocese. We could easily go up there and back in a day - either a Saturday or even a Sunday afternoon. What do you think?

LENT We are approaching Lent - it is good to start pondering what you might do for this holy season. We are called to penance, prayer and good works/almsgiving. Prayer: we will have our regular mini-stations at Corpus Christi, 8.25am Thurs mornings; we will have Stations at 6pm every Friday. I'm also inviting you to join in Morning and Evening Prayer for Lent. This is sometimes called the Office, or the Prayer of the Church. It is part of what priests, deacons and religious commit to. It is based on the psalms and takes 10-15 minutes each morning and evening. What do you think? People get a bit nervous about how we say it - 'getting it right'. Firstly, God isn't going to tut if we don't quite get it right: he sees the heart. Secondly, you could get a Morning and Evening Prayer book, but if you do have a mobile phone, I'm suggesting you download the Universalis app. It costs a one-off payment of £10 for life. Then, I'm inviting you to a 45 minute meeting at St Anne's on Saturday 1st March, 10.30am, where I can go through the app with you, and also talk a little bit more about what the prayer of the Church is. After that Universalis does it all for you (except the praying!) It will give you the right psalms and prayers each morning and evening. Simple. Have a think. It's a way of praying together, but from our own homes. Almsgiving: we've done well with our clearing the debt at St Anne's. Someone has suggested a last push during Lent: each day put a coin aside for the debt, and on Palm Sunday bring what you've collected and add it to the 2nd collection. Also, the Homeless Centre in Chase Avenue will be opening fairly shortly. The management have been very good in keeping us informed of progress etc., not least with the school being right next door. The school has suggested that it would be good if we could collect toiletries, so that when any new resident arrives they have a useful gift waiting for them from the local Catholic community. I think it is a lovely idea. So, should we join in? During Lent, any food donated will go to the foodbank, but any toiletries we give to the Homeless Centre?

DAY OF RECOLLECTION FOR EUCHARIST MINISTERS: is at St Thomas More Church on Saturday 22nd March, 9.30am Mass - 1pm soup and sandwiches. This fulfils the commitment ministers made when you were last commissioned, so unless you've already been on such a day already since last Maundy Thursday, this is a must.

FIRST CONFESSION PREPARATION continues to go really well. Sunday Gospel booklets are available for those who didn't get one. We break for half term in our sessions, but not in sharing in Sunday Mass. Next session is Thursday 27th February, 6pm at Corpus Christi. I think it's actually been good timing that we're trying some YouTube hymns at the end of Sunday Mass, just as our children are preparing for the sacraments - I think they appreciate the effort we're making to make them feel welcome and belong.
