The sacrifices of those who go and the generosity of those who stayed back to support those who go, has made the Church to be the biggest and most influential organisation carrying out charitable work on planet earth.

The 2024 Parish Financial Statement is available on the church notice board at the back of the Church. As your parish priest, I notice how generous the people of this parish are in supporting its work. Like myself, the "Parish Finance Team" are immensely grateful to you, since it is from your donations that they can carefully plan the payment of wish to thank you all for your continued financial support and generosity. As the physical expenses of the parish such as repairs to parish property, insurance and all sorts of bills. Because of your financial generosity, the church is kept warm, we have better lighting, we have managed to insure Church building and to pay on time the diocesan levy, most of which goes to the maintenance of our Catholic Schools. The list can go on...!

The Statement shows, that last year 2024, the parish spent £2,854.00 more than it received. It is a duty for each parishioner to reduce our community expenses to minimise cost. A tap of water left running, doors left open that let heat run out, heating left on after using the hall, or letting children play with Mass books as though they are toys, contribute to the parish financial deficit. Church property is your property because when something goes wrong, it has to be fixed. There is much work to do to update, improve and maintain this lovely church of Our Lady's that we all love.

As you can see from the statement "Gift Aid - Tax refund" has proved to be a very important and vital source of income for the parish. From the bottom of my heart, I wish to thank parishioners who give Sunday donation through this scheme. I think this arrangement is what makes the citizens of this country really great. All you have to do if you pay tax on your income, is to fill a form by putting your name and signature so that the donations you give to the church be considered as Gift Aid. For every £ you donate, the parish receives an addition of £0.25 pence from the government to increase your donation to your Charity which in this case is your parish Church. So those who are tax payers, and have not yet joined the "Gift Aid Scheme", please do - it costs you nothing extra. Contact Fr. Jimmy or Stephanie Taunton, the Parish Administrator for more details.

Last year, the Parish received from the government £15,820.55 as a support for the parishioner who pay tax on their income and make donations to the church as well. They did not give extra, but the Church benefited through their action. As your parish priest, I consider it as my duty to warn you or to give you guidance in some practical aspects of life. Registering your Sunday donations under Gift Aid is something I recommend to every taxpayer of this parish.
