Consecrated Life is a Model of Christian Living

In 1997, Saint Pope John Paul II declared the feast of the Presentation of the Lord as the World Day for Consecrated Life. In our parish, the clearest sign of Consecrated Life are our two sisters: Sr. Leena Mathias and Sr. Leera Lobo, who belong to the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Anne of Providence. Of course, the priests of our parish, members of the Religious Missionary Institute of the Apostles of Jesus, are also in a similar category. This means that Consecrated Life is a daily reality in our parish, and I am happy that many do recognise it. The question is whether you see how that form of life is connected to your daily life as a Christian. This is the question I am addressing here.

What constitutes consecrated life is its nature of dedication to the Lord that sets one apart to belong to God in a unique way, so as to spend their entire life seeking to solely do what God wills of them. The key element of all forms of consecrated life are the religious vows of chastity, poverty and obedience; community life provides the appropriate setting in which that lifestyle is enhanced in daily programmes of prayer and ministry. Each congregation specialises in an aspect of Jesus's ministry such as: prayer, evangelization, healing, teaching, publishing etc, which are all geared towards promoting the Kingdom of God.

This form of consecrated life is connected with the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. This is in following an ancient Jewish tradition that has its roots in the liberation from Egypt and the Sinaitic covenant. Accordingly, every first-born male was consecrated to the Lord, as an acknowledgement of God's goodness and mercy in saving his people from their humiliating slavery in Egypt. In consecrating their first born to God, they expressed their thanks and made God's saving action present for every generation.

Members of the societies of consecrated life in the Church serve as a constant reminder of our own consecration to God in the Sacrament of Baptism in which we are set apart for God and become members of the Church, as St Peter declares: '... you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation for God's own possession that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light'.
