The Youth Mass: to Pray and Discern

Thanks to Fr. Reginald and Perpetua Sam, today we have the Youth Holy Mass at 2pm. It is expected that all young people in our community aged 15 years of age and above, will gather in our Church to pray together. Our young people, who include secondary school students, university students, fresh graduates, fresh professionals, and those who are discerning a vocation, will gather to pray together. They will not consider the Youth Mass a kind of performance, but a coming together in the presence of God to praise, worship and listen to God speaking to their hearts. This arrangement is timely as we progress with the celebrations of the Jubilee Year that invites us to be Pilgrims of Hope. The word of God today is challenging us to reflect on true blessedness; this is relevant to all - the young and the elderly alike.

The beatitudes in today's Gospel, teachings on blessedness, as presented by our Lord Jesus Christ, carry the eternal truth that contradict the commonly hailed beliefs. They are statements that carry the eternal wisdom of a believer in God, they are therefore statements of faith. At their heart is the fundamental truth: real happiness is to be found in total trust in God and a complete surrender to God's ways amidst the circumstances of one's life.

This is true for the elderly as well as for the young. Certainly, the contemporary cultural trends give an impression that real happiness is to be found in transient pleasures, large amounts of possessions, and a show of power that humiliates the other.

Our Lord teaches the contrary: real happiness is to be found in humble surrender to God and the generous service of our neighbours for God's sake, amidst misunderstandings and persecutions. Young people today are invited to identify, and stand up for, truth as they interact with various teachings and discernment. Proper discernment for a holy life is in listening attentively to oneself, but also to the wisdom of elders which is ultimately inspired by the Word of God. In this spirit, let us support our young people as they continue with their search for a happy and blessed life. The Youth Mass is a valuable opportunity for young people to pray as they discern their lifetime calling to follow God's holy will.

Our Parish our Home (See Canon Law):

Can. 515 §1. A parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (parochus) as its proper pastor (pastor) under the authority of the diocesan shop.
