


THE WORD OF THE LORD

Theme of today's readings: Divine revelations

First reading Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18 The Patriarch Abraham put his faith in God, and he received a reward that echoed down through the generations of his family to find its fulfilment in his descendant, Jesus of Nazareth (Matthew I:1). As a reward for his righteousness, God revealed himself to Abraham and sealed his relationship in a ritual that ratified an unconditional covenant as God's Presence passed through a pathway of the pieces of sacrificed animals in the form of "a smoking firepot and a flaming torch."

Psalm 27 The psalmist celebrates his visit to the Lord's Temple in Jerusalem by proclaiming his joy in his Lord and confidence that God is his light, guiding him on the path to salvation. The risen Christ fulfils the psalmist's hope to one day be with his LORD in "the land of the living" since heaven is the true Sanctuary of God that Jesus has opened for all who believe in Him as Lord and Saviour.

Second reading *Philippians* 3:17-4:1 St. Paul wrote that those who occupy their lives with earthly pursuits must let go of those material things and look to heaven for the transforming experience Jesus promised all Christians. The time will come when he will give the faithful a new form to our bodies, just as three Apostles witnessed in the Transfiguration experience. We are destined to receive a glorious transformation and an intimate revelation of God when Christ brings us into his heavenly Kingdom.

Gospel Luke 9:28-36 The Apostles Peter, James and John experienced a divine revelation to strengthen their faith in preparation for the ordeal they and the other disciples would face at the climax of Jesus's earthly ministry. Jesus led them up a mountain, revealing a divine vision of himself. They saw Christ in his glory and experienced the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity: God the Son in his glory, God the Holy Spirit in the cloud that overshadowed them, and God the Father's voice from heaven announcing his pleasure in his Son and the command to "Listen to him."

STATIONS OF THE CROSS IN LENT There are two opportunities to pray the Stations of the Cross together each week during Lent: **Wednesdays at 10.30am** (jointly with St. Mary Magdalen's) and **Thursdays at 6.45pm.** It if course also possible to pray Stations of the Cross privately in church or at home. There are various sets of reflections and meditations available for your use at the back of church.

CHURCHES TOGETHER LENTEN LUNCHES Each Tuesday of Lent Christians of the different churches in our area get together for a simple Lenten lunch (soup and bread) at 12noon and for reflection and prayer. We are the host church this Tuesday, 18th March, so please try to be here if you can.

TO KEEP A TRUE LENT

Fasting – either complete abstinence from all food on certain days, or from a particular type of food for the entire forty days – has for centuries been a traditional Lenten discipline. In this poem, Robert Herrick (1591-1674), an English poet and Anglican clergyman, explores the intended meaning behind such self-denial, emphasising the spiritual meaning of a fast. His poem is as challenging as it is beautiful. What is it to keep a true Lent?

Is this a Fast, to keep The Larder lean? And clean From fat of veals and sheep?

Is it to quit the dish
Of flesh, yet still
To fill
The platter high with fish?

Is it to fast an hour, Or ragg'd go, Or show A down-cast look and sour?

No: 'tis a Fast to dole Thy sheaf of wheat And meat Unto the hungry soul.

It is to fast from strife And old debate, And hate; To circumcise thy life.⁺



To show a heart grief-rent; To starve thy sin, Not bin; And that's to keep thy Lent.

⁺ Circumcision is often used as a metaphor for spiritual conversion, as in St. Paul's description of Abraham, who "received the sign of circumcision as a seal of the righteousness that he had by faith while he was still uncircumcised" (Romans 3:11).
