#### First Sunday of Lent Year C

Readings: Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Ps. 91; Rom. 10:8-13; Lk 4:1-13

We are in Lent.

Lent is preparation. The celebration of the most sublime paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ needs solemn spiritual preparation. Israel prepared for forty years before entering into the promised land; Jesus prepared for forty days (Lk4:1-2), to enter into his public ministry, which led him to death of the cross; so too we prepare during Lent in order to enter into the depth of Christ's Passion and then into Easter joy. We prepare by intensive prayer. To us, prayer ought not to be what dolls are to children, just comforting. We must take prayer seriously, at least during Lent, and find time to be alone with God in solitude for solitude is the audience chamber of God. We prepare through frequent attendance at Mass and the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Particularly we prepare through daily meditation of God's word. This is a favourable time...

Lent is Purification. If we want to be friends with God, as in all friendships we have to keep it in constant repair. We have to get rid of those spiritual obstacles which hinder us from responding fully to God's love. We must try to remove even our small faults, for men stumble on stones not on mountains. Our actions need purification. In our action, if we give priority to the physical rather than to the spiritual, we deny, that "man does not live by bread alone" (Lk 4:4) not only the end of our actions but the means we use to obtain them have to be also good. Jesus refused to cast himself down from the pinnacle of the Temple (Lk 4:12), for that was not God's way to make his mission a success. Life is not a football game, where you may be careful about the goal, but indifferent to the ball.

Lent is Participation. We will fast in Lent. Many of us would deny ourselves some of our cherished pleasures as a penance, for wanting in the past more than our fair share of the good things in life, even though millions of the children in the world die of hunger in days. Some of us will give up part of our comforts to the homeless. We will do all these and many other sacrifices not out of duty, but as our loving participation in the Passion and death of our Lord. Yes, if we are to be remade, reborn and turned around, we need to be first broken to pieces. Those who suffer in union with Christ on the cross suffer to end all suffering.

**Lent is Proclamation.** In Lent, we proclaim that "God who brought our forefathers out of Egypt with a strong hand and outstretched arms" (Deut. 26:8) will bring us also to freedom through the cross of his Son, for it was on the cross that freedom's battle against evil was won. Throughout Lent we profess our faith that "Jesus is the Lord who died and rose from the dead" (Rom 10:9), not only to break our chains here and now but also finally to lead us into the land of free and the home of the brave. Without this faith, penance will be preposterous. Hence during Lent, we have to cling not just to the forms of faith, but to faith itself. Faith is not a feeling but a conviction. With an active faith and fire within, Lent can offer us a new beginning and it is never too late to begin. It is better to begin in the evening, than not at all.
