

THE WORD OF THE LORD

Theme of today's readings: God prepares the way

First reading Isaiah 43:16-21 The people of God, condemned to exile in Babylon, received hope from the book of the prophet Isaiah, written a century and a half earlier. Isaiah told them that the time would come when they could let go of the sad events of the past, which had led to their exile through his divine judgment. In the future they would look to God's promise of restoration as he prepared the way for their return to their "Promised Land," just as he did during the Exodus liberation when he opened a path through the Red Sea on their journey out of Egypt.

Psalm 126 As pilgrims journeyed to the holy city of Jerusalem, they recalled the "coming home" and restoration of the covenant people to their "Promised Land" after the Babylonian exile. Just as the returning exiles were joyous in travelling the way God prepared for them to return from Babylon to Jerusalem, the pilgrims experienced a joyful journey to God's holy city of Jerusalem to worship in his Holy Temple.

Second reading *Philippians 3:8-14* St. Paul calls for unshakable faith in God to guide us on the path to eternal salvation in the "Promised Land" of heaven. Paul tells us to forget about the hardships we have endured in the past and to push forward on our journey of faith. He assures Christians that we travel the path God has prepared for us with the promise that no matter what our struggles, the trials we endure are worth the prize at the end of our journey: our eternal salvation in Christ Jesus. God prepares us for a new Exodus liberation. He redeems us from bondage to sin and death through the sacrificial death and the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Gospel John 8:1-11 The Pharisees tested Jesus by asking him to judge the case of a woman accused of adultery. Her choices may have caused her suffering, but that does not mean that God would not offer her his grace to be restored and forgiven. God can rescue us as he saved her by offering repentance and salvation through the intervention of God the Son. Like the woman caught in adultery, God urges all of us to receive his mercy by repenting of our sins and resolving to sin no more, as he continues to "make a way" for us on our journey to eternal salvation.

HELP DEFEAT THE ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL AT ITS THIRD READING Please take a card – Help us to live, not to die – from the back of church and send it ASAP to your Member of Parliament urging them to attend Parliament for the Third Reading of the Assisted Suicide Bill on or soon after 25th April and to VOTE AGAINST IT. Lord Alton and Baroness Campbell urge us to act: Our nation stands at a critical juncture regarding how we value human life, particularly the lives of people in the most vulnerable situations. If this significant proposal to introduce assisted suicide becomes law, thousands of individuals will be placed at risk in the coming years. It is, therefore, imperative that this Assisted Suicide Bill is defeated at its Third Hearing. One of the most effective ways to persuade MPs to oppose this dangerous Bill is through physical letters or postcards sent from constituents asking them to vote "no" to the Bill.
