# Churches Together in Earlsdon and Chapelfields PALM SUNDAY EVENING SERVICE



Please come along to an hour-long service for Holy Week with our friends from the other local churches, here today at 6.30pm. The liturgies of the latter days of Holy Week — Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday - are intense and rich; this evening's service is a simpler service of Bible readings, hymns and prayers on the Lord's Passion.

#### "COULD YOU NOT WATCH ONE HOUR?"

Throughout Holy Week, the Church's liturgies take us through, and incorporate us into, the most dramatic events of salvation history. They are longer, typically, and not necessarily what we are used to experiencing on most Sundays throughout the year. But we miss out on so much if we're not present at them. Wherever you are over Easter – at home, visiting relatives, on holiday – Holy Week is HOLY Week and attendance at Mass on Easter Sunday remains an obligation. Let's joyfully celebrate this week and the salvation Christ has won for us, setting aside time to be present at the main liturgies. How many hours do you typically spend on social media or watching TV or shopping each day; how many hours per week do you set aside for a football match or film at the cinema or drinks in the pub? How long will you spend with the Lord in prayer and worship this week? Fr. Paul

HELP DEFEAT THE ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL AT ITS THIRD READING Please take a card – Help us to live, not to die – from the back of church and send it ASAP to your Member of Parliament urging them to attend Parliament for the Third Reading of the Assisted Suicide Bill on or soon after 25<sup>th</sup> April and to VOTE AGAINST IT. Lord Alton and Baroness Campbell urge us to act: Our nation stands at a critical juncture regarding how we value human life, particularly the lives of people in the most vulnerable situations. If this significant proposal to introduce assisted suicide becomes law, thousands of individuals will be placed at risk in the coming years. It is, therefore, imperative that this Assisted Suicide Bill is defeated at its Third Hearing. One of the most effective ways to persuade MPs to oppose this dangerous Bill is through physical letters or postcards sent from constituents asking them to vote "no" to the Bill.

**PRAYER VIGIL FOR LIFE** Join the Candlelight Prayer vigil for Life organised by March for Life UK at 7pm on **Sunday 27**th **April** (**Divine Mercy Sunday**) in Victoria Square, Birmingham to remember the 57th anniversary of the implementation of the Abortion Act. Please come and join in this peaceful, prayerful time of reflection with speeches from Christian leaders as we recall the lives lost and wounded from the legalisation of abortion.
