Welcome to Mass today. We extend a special welcome to anybody joining us for the first time. Please introduce yourself, and if you are able, stay for refreshments after the Mass.

Welcome to Mass on this Easter Day. For those visiting the parish today to celebrate our Lord's resurrection, it is good that you are with us. Some years ago, Pope Benedict spoke about today's feast:

'At Easter we rejoice because Christ did not remain in the tomb, his body did not see corruption; he belongs to the world of the living, not to the world of the dead; we rejoice because he is the Alpha and also the Omega, as we proclaim in the rite of the Paschal Candle; he lives not only yesterday, but today and for eternity.'

These words are so important – that Easter isn't just about looking back to something that once happened. Neither do we say Christ was risen - but that Christ is risen!

Jesus, who was crucified and buried in the tomb whilst Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, is alive. It is this risen Jesus whom we meet in the sacraments. It is the risen Jesus who dwells within us through the gift of the Eucharist. It is the risen Lord who is head of his mystical body – the Church.

All the apostles were witnesses to the resurrection. At various places and at various times (with the exception of St John the Evangelist who continued his apostolic ministry into old age) died a martyr's death rather than deny what they had heard and seen – that the risen Jesus showed himself to them, spoke to them, and they saw the wounds in his hands, feet and side – the wounds of divine love.



Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed!

Alleluia!

PRAYER AT THE EASTER GARDEN: Risen Lord Jesus, as Mary Magdalene met you in the garden on the morning of your resurrection, so may I meet you today and every day: speak to me as you spoke to her in the living word of your Gospel; reveal yourself as the living Lord in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar; renew my hope and kindle my joy, and send me to share the good news of the Gospel with others. Amen.

EASTER OCTAVE: Each day of the Easter Octave, like the Christmas Octave, is celebrated as 'Easter Day.' At each of the Masses the Gloria is recited and at the end of each Mass the double Alleluia is used. The Gospel readings that we hear during this week relate to various appearances of the Risen Jesus. Each day during the Octave, we proclaim in the Gospel Acclamation: this is the day the Lord has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it.

REGINA COELI: One of the most joyous anthems of the Church is the Regina Coeli, the Easter hymn to Our Lady. In a fearful pestilence our Lady's portrait reputedly painted by St. Luke was being carried in a procession which included Pope St. Gregory the Great. As they approached St. Peter's Basilica, the air became pure and free of pestilence. At the bridge which joins Rome to the Vatican, angels were heard singing the first three verses from the Regina Coeli and St Gregory was inspired to add the fourth line 'pray for to us to God, alleluia.' This prayer reminds us, of how much we have to be thankful for, even in the midst of our daily trials. When our Lord conquered death in His resurrection, he opened the gates of Heaven for us to be able to share Eternal Life with Him.

O Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia. For He whom you did merit to bear, alleluia. Has risen, as he said, alleluia. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
