## THE WORD OF THE LORD

### The theme of today's readings: Finding joy in Christ

**First reading** Acts 13:14,43b-52 Despite hardships and persecutions, the Church has persevered in remaining faithful to her mission to be God's vehicle of salvation "to the ends of the earth" (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47-48; Acts 1:8). Saints Paul and Barnabas had the joyful experience of bringing many people to Christ, but they also had to endure rejection and persecution. However, even in those experiences, they were not discouraged, but continued to be "filled with joy and the Holy Spirit."

**Psalm 100** invites us to proclaim with joy the Lord's kingship over the whole earth. It reminds us that we should express our praise and worship of God with joy because we have the Lord's assurance that we are the adopted and covenant children of our heavenly Father. Our joyfulness stems from our faith that "the Lord is God" and the conviction that we belong to him and feel secure in our unique relationship with him as his beloved people.

### Second reading Revelation 7:9, 13a, 14b-17

This reading continues the theme of joy in Christ even when confronted by persecution. In the Book of the Revelation of Jesus Christ to St. John, the Lord grants John a glorious vision of the saints of the universal Church *from every nation, race, people, and tongue* who suffered martyrdom because of their faith in Jesus Christ. The multitude of persecuted Christian saints that John sees has been washed clean in "the blood of the Lamb." They joyfully worship for eternity in the Presence of the Most Holy Trinity in the heavenly sanctuary.

#### Gospel John 10:27-30

Those who accept Jesus as their Lord and Saviour are the "sheep of his flock" who know his "voice" and "follow him". To his faithful "sheep" Jesus extends the gift of eternal life and the reassuring promise that no one can separate them from him. Like Saints Paul and Barnabas, we are also called to be joyfully confident that Christ the Good Shepherd will continually care for the members of his faithful flock and his promise that nothing can separate us from God's love.



## POPE LEO XIV

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2025 the College of Cardinals elected Cardinal Robert Prevost as the 267<sup>th</sup> Pope, the 266<sup>th</sup> successor of Saint Peter the Apostle. He has chosen the papal name Leo.

Naturally, speculation, prediction, analysis and opinion abound already as to what kind of pope Leo XIV will be: what his priorities will be; whether he represents continuity or change or both. Time will tell. What is most important right now is that we **pray** for him, mindful that he is not elected as CEO of the Catholic Church, but as a *spiritual* leader and *shepherd* of those redeemed by the Precious Blood of Christ. May Pope Leo above all else use his God-given authority faithfully and courageously to shepherd us and all people to Jesus Christ, his holy Catholic Church, and to heaven. May he help the Church to remain one, holy, catholic and apostolic in a world that pulls us in all directions.

Lord, source of eternal life and truth, give to your shepherd, Leo, a spirit of courage and right judgment, a spirit of knowledge and love. By governing with fidelity those entrusted to his care, may he, as successor to the Apostle Saint Peter, build your Church into a sacrament of unity, love, and peace for all the world. Amen.
