THE WORD OF THE LORD

The theme of today's readings: The reward of continuing and persevering in faith

First reading Acts 14:21b-27 The Holy Spirit commanded the vibrant Christian community at Antioch, Syria, to commission Saints Barnabas and Paul to take a missionary journey to the Gentiles living in Asia Minor. Despite opposition from the Jews, who incited crowds to stone and beat them, Barnabas and Paul established the first Christian communities in the Roman provinces of Pisidia and Pamphylia in obedience to Jesus's command to take the Gospel of salvation beyond Judah and Samaria to the "ends of the earth.

Psalm 145 invites everyone to praise God, whose mighty works make his divine presence known to his people.

Second reading Revelation 21:1-5a Formerly, God's divine presence resided in the Holy of Holies of the Jerusalem Temple. In the age of the Messiah, his Spirit lives in the reborn lives of all baptised believers whose bodies become temples of the Holy Spirit. At the end of the Messianic Age there will be a new kind of divine presence. St. John has a vision of the "new Jerusalem" coming down from heaven as the new Temple for humanity's redeemed covenant people. All that is "new" is initially already present in the lives of Christians, but it will not be established fully until the Second Coming of Christ, when the events that St. John witnessed will take place.

Gospel John 13:31-33a,34-35 In the course of the Last Supper Jesus encouraged his disciples concerning events that would soon take place and told them about his coming glorification. He also gave them a "new commandment." He called them to love one another as he has loved them; that is, with sacrificial self-giving rooted in Jesus' self-sacrificial death and resurrection. This unique willingness to submit oneself to the self-sacrificial love of Christ is a characteristic that will distinguish Christians. Are we living that love in our lives and relationships with others? It is a love that has changed the world, has offered hope to every generation since Christ's Ascension to the Father, and will continue to provide hope until his return in glory.

DAY FOR LIFE Every year the Church in England, Wales, Scotland, and Ireland marks the *Day for Life*, as a reminder of the need to respect and protect the inherent value and dignity of each life. This year it is on **Sunday 15th June**, Trinity Sunday. The bishops invite us to join in praying the Novena for Life. This will run up to the Feast of the Visitation, between the 23rd and 31st of May. Prayers for each day can be found on the *Day for Life* page of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales website. On the website you can also find a special message from the bishops and more prayers and resources. On Sunday 15th June our parish will hold a **second collection** for the *Day for Life Fund*. Every year the fund allocates over £200,000 in grants to organisations which promote respect for life in various ways. INAUGURATION OF POPE LEO XIV'S PONTIFICATE

Pope Leo XIV's pontificate is officially and solemnly inaugurated with Mass in St. Peter's Square today at I 0am Rome time. Although he was pope from the moment he accepted his election on 8th May, the inauguration Mass – which replaced the papal coronation after the pontificate of St. Paul VI – formally marks the beginning of his ministry as the Successor of St. Peter with his reception of the fisherman's ring and the pallium, a woollen band worn around his shoulders.
