LORD YOU CAN READ EVERYONE'S HEART SHOW US THE ONE YOU HAVE CHOSEN

During the week I received telephone calls inquiring about the election of the new pope. Some callers wanted to know which Cardinal was best suited for the job, another one was asking whether Cardinal Vincent Nichols was getting the job this time. Obviously there has been a lot of excitement, but a lot of ignorance too. The election of the Pope is by no means similar to any of our political elections no matter how democratic they might claim to be.

The Catholic Church is the oldest Institution to hold nomination and elections. The pope is chosen by the cardinal electors in a voting process during the papal conclave. This event occurs after a pope dies or resigns. A Pope is usually chosen from among the cardinals, although any baptised male can be elected. When a candidate achieves two-thirds majority he is chosen and chooses his papal name.

The conclave begins 15 to 20 days after the pope's death. The conclave following Benedict XVI's resignation in 2013 convened 12 days later. The interior of the conclave area inside the palace was formerly divided into small apartments (cellae), one for each cardinal, assigned by lot. Cardinals now reside in the Domus Sanctae Marthae ("St. Martha's House"), a hotel-like building constructed for visiting clergy during the reign of John Paul II.

Extra omnes (Latin: "Outside, all") is the command given by the master of pontifical liturgical celebrations before the cardinals are sealed inside the Sistine Chapel to vote. Only the cardinal electors remain inside the chapel after everyone else, leaves. Strict security measures are taken to ensure the procedure. The cardinal camerlengo seals off the pope's apartment. The area of the papal conclave is also completely sealed off for the duration of the gathering; only the cardinals and their secretaries, the masters of ceremonies, certain other ecclesiastics with specific duties related to the election, doctors, and the service staff may enter. The cardinals are denied access to all news media and are strictly forbidden to use telephones of any type or personal computers. They swear an oath of secrecy, nothing is ever divulged to anyone.

Vote is secret until a candidate has been selected. One ballot is held on the first day of the papal conclave and four on each subsequent day, two in the morning and two in the afternoon. During each ballot, the cardinal electors write the name of the person they have selected on their individual ballot papers. These are collected and tallied in an elaborate process involving three "scrutineers." Each scrutineer reads each vote before passing it to the next scrutineer; the first two scrutineers read each name in silence, and the third scrutineer reads the name out loud and then writes it. The ballot papers are then threaded with a needle, and, in this manner, all of them are kept together for security. After the count, the ballot papers and all related notes are burned in a stove in the chapel. The colour of the smoke passing from a pipe through the roof enables the outside world to know how the voting has gone: when no candidate has received the required majority, the smoke is black; if a new pope has been elected, the smoke is white. The elected Cardinal is formally asked whether he accepts his election and what name he wishes to assume. Upon his acceptance, the news is announced to the world. The senior cardinal deacon appears on the central balcony of St. Peter's and declares, "Habemus papam" ("We have a pope").
