SUNDAY 31st AUGUST PARISH FAMILY THANKSGIVING DAY

King David has been spoken about as the composer of the psalms. He was a man with great love of music, he enjoyed playing the harp, which was the entertaining musical instrument of his time, just as we have the guitar today. His love to praise Yahweh the God of Israel through music, merited him the attribute that he was the sole composer of all the 150 Psalms we find in the Bible. Biblical scholarship think otherwise! Psalms are hymns of Israel which fit every occasion and circumstance. They are to be sang not recited. The custom of singing the responsorial Psalm at our Sunday Mass evokes the true nature of the psalms, namely that they are hymns of praise, supplication, intercession and thanksgiving.

More than 30 times, the psalmist spoke of the need and the greatness of giving thanks to Yahweh. Psalm 92:1 puts it plainly "It is good to give thanks to the Lord" to remind us that thanksgiving is a part of the most intimate relationship that exists between God and his people.

Looking back, we notice that there will always be something we need to thank God for, such as life, the family to which we belong, the work we do, the people we live with, the children or the parents who brought us up. Forty years ago **Fr. John Obrien** was ordained to the priesthood and twenty five years ago, **Michael Skidmore** was ordained to permanent diaconate. The list is endless. It is within this context that I feel that as a parish, we should come together as a community and offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving to God. In our thanksgiving prayer, we also include those members of our families and community who have departed this life whose happy memory we cherish. We shall thank God for them even though they are not physically here with us. Therefore, parish thanksgiving day incorporates many other things that we need to place before God.

Our Parish Family Thanksgiving Day will take place on 31st August 2025. To make it's a day of thanksgiving for the family, I request that we do what we did last year, each family will prepare a family meal at home and bring it to the parish hall where we shall share it together with other families, who, as I know will also have brought some food from their homes to share it with you. Letting other people share what you have cooked is a great act of charity and family spirit. In the act of thanksgiving this year, we shall not be alone; I'm pleased to let you know that the Choir of St. Mary's and Benedict Church Coventry, has accepted to sing at our Sunday Mass on that day. In the present circumstances where practicing Catholics are not increasing in number, we can build our mission by opening up to each other, sharing our joys together, planning and celebrating our faith as a community, rather than acting in isolation.

I'm sure that you have started thinking about what you can do to show your thankfulness to God. We are the parish, we are the Church, indeed we are the people of God. Come let us spend time together outside the Mass by eating together, talking to each other, catching up with news concerning our lives.

We are tired of watching TV, please prepare some entertainments, in music, poems or drama. This is the event that brings all families together in one act of thanksgiving If you wish to contribute any idea to this event please let me or Mrs Pat Rudkin know.
