Third Sunday of Easter Year C

Readings: Acts 5:27b-32, 40b-41, Ps.30(29); Revelation 5:11-14; Jn.21:1-19

Returning to the Centre.

Falling in love is charming in life; but there is always some madness in love, and some reason in madness. So, a boy and a girl falling in love married, but after a few years, falling out of love began, because problems arose bills mounting up, work uncertain, sickness and monotony. He wanted to make love, she didn't. She wanted to go to the theatre, he didn't. He wanted to save money; she wanted to spend it on a holiday. She wanted just to talk; he wanted to watch football. She did not like his family; he didn't like hers. So, there love cracked, and their life rocked. However, no permanent damage was done, for they realised that they were two separate persons, and each cannot be owned or possessed by the other. Hence, they chose to return to love, the centre of their life. Love after reunion was not like their first passion. But after reconciliation their love became truly real.

This is the story of every love. St Peter the apostle loved Christ. But in the beginning his love was only an emotion. St Peter denied Christ three times, but he repented and returned to the centre of his life, Christ, with renewed real love. We too love Christ and love him dearly. If he were to ask each of us, as he asked St Peter (Jn 21:15), "Do you love me?" we would readily reply, "Yes, Lord, I love you; every time I think of you...." If he would ask a second time, we would respond, "Lord. Yes, I love you..." If he would ask the same question a third time, we would protest saying, "Lord, you know that I love you. My love can conquer all things, including death." Indeed, we do love Christ, but the fabric of our love will begin to unravel when we start our travel along with him. For on our travel, we will encounter trials: the presence of trial will tell us how great our love is, but its absence will raise the question how long our love will be.

Trial will come when we try to "feed his lambs" (Jn 21:16), not just with the bread of the Eucharist, but with real food and drink. The eucharist is not just liturgy and ceremony, but loving and sharing, feeding the hungry, sustaining the homeless and mentally sick with acceptance, nourishing our youth by openness, and supporting our aged by high esteem. Trial will come when we are called to join the parish faith-sharing group, The Parish Pastoral Council, justice and peace group, The Women of Faith group, and similar action groups to build the kingdom of God. At this, such trials would hit us like a migraine blotting out reason. If we could not bear our suffering joyfully for Christ's sake, will there be any reward? So, will our sufferings for the love of Christ lead us to something important?

If our love for Christ has become shaky during our difficult travel with him, he calls us back to him to renew our love. It does not matter even if we have divorced him in our hearts – after all, divorce has become so common today that a wedding is the only prerequisite for a divorce now. Let us only return to him, he will receive us. It is only we who often write off other people; on the strength of one or two unfriendly encounters with them, we rarely give them one more chance. But Jesus is different. If there is even the slightest hope of rekindling in us the flame of the smouldering wick, he would not extinguish it. the Christian love story is one of calling, falling, and recalling. Christ is recalling us: are we returning to our centre?
