

## THE WORD OF THE LORD

# The theme of today's readings: Sharing in the Life of Christ

**First reading** Genesis 14:18-20 The inspired writer of the Letter to the Hebrews quotes Genesis 14:19 and interprets Melchizedek, God's righteous priest-king of Salem, the "city of peace," as prefiguring Jesus, the High Priest and King of the heavenly "city of peace" and its Sanctuary in the Kingdom of Heaven.

**Psalm 110** The first reading prepares us for a psalm which prophesies the future coming of One who, like Melchizedek, will be a priest forever. **Second reading** *I Corinthians 11:23-26* St. Paul repeats the Church's oldest account of the words of consecration in the celebration of the Eucharist, apart from Jesus's declaration to the disciples at the Last Supper. Paul received Jesus' words concerning the Eucharist in the same way they have been passed on to us throughout the centuries. St. Paul invited the Corinthian Christians to meditate on the meaning of the Eucharistic banquet. He wrote that for those who belong to Christ, the Eucharist signifies not only oneness with Jesus, who feeds the faithful with his glorified Body and Blood, but also of the Church which is One Body in Christ. Christians celebrate this unity in the Eucharist in every generation until Christ comes again in glory.

**Gospel** Luke 9:11b-17 The Gospel Reading concerns Jesus' miraculous feeding of the 5,000 men (not counting women and children). At first glance, this story appears to be primarily concerned with Jesus' compassion and his supernatural ability to meet the needs of the crowd that came to hear him preach; however, there is much more to be understood about this event. Jesus' miracle feedings of the 5,000 men and later the crowd of 4,000 men (Matthew 15:38) recalled for the people of his time the past feeding miracles of God and his prophets in the Old Testament. Jesus' two miracle feedings also <u>prefigured</u> his greater miraculous feeding of the disciples with his Body and Blood at the Last Supper, a miracle he promised in his Bread of Life Discourse after feeding the 5,000 (John 6:22-65). The continuation of the miracle feeding at the Last Supper is the celebration of the Eucharistic banquet, as Jesus continues to provide abundantly for the spiritual nourishment of his Church, in every generation, on every Catholic altar. The Eucharistic banquet also anticipates the faithful's participation in the Wedding Supper of the Lamb in the heavenly Sanctuary at the end of time.

#### THE DIGNITY AND SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE

The Catholic Church believes that only God can create life and that from the moment of conception he gives each human being a unique, unrepeatable, and immortal soul. This understanding leads Catholics to believe in the innate dignity and sanctity of every human life, and to defend all human life from the moment of conception until natural death. It is a teaching that hasn't changed and will remain constant, even when legislators vote to change the law of the land (the UK House of Commons voted on 17<sup>th</sup> June 2025 to decriminalise abortion after 24 weeks and up to birth, and on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2025 to legalise 'assisted dying'.)

Both prayer and action are needed to bring about a renewed "culture of life" in our society, one that respects each individual and sees them as children of God.

Here is a prayer that asks God to strengthen us in this battle to protect human life in all its stages.

O God our Creator, we give thanks to you, who alone have the power to impart the breath of life as you form each of us in our mother's womb; grant, we pray, that we, whom you have made stewards of creation, may remain faithful to this sacred trust and constant in safeguarding the dignity of every human life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Ps. 139:13
