

# THE WORD OF THE LORD

# The theme of today's readings: Unity in Christ

# First reading Acts 7:55-60

Living in the image of Christ and celebrating the sacraments established by him unite the members of the Church on earth. Our union here on earth gives us hope for our future in the Communion of Saints in the Kingdom of Heaven. We should come to the sacraments often in order to grow in the image of Christ and strengthen our union with one another. In our first reading, the soon-to-be martyred St. Stephen is blessed with a vision of Christ waiting to receive him into the heavenly reality. When we reach the end of this earthly life, we all have the hope of experiencing the vision of our loving Christ welcoming us into his heavenly Kingdom.

**Psalm 97** proclaims the universal kingship of God. It gives us the joy and confidence to proclaim that God has sovereign authority over all the earth, and there is nothing this world can do to change that or to take away our gift of eternal salvation.

# Second reading Revelation 22:12-14,16-17,20

The words Jesus speaks to us in the second reading are a promise of his Second Coming. When Christ returns, he will come in glory as the King of all Creation to render his divine judgment to the wicked and give his reward to the righteous. May we always keep our baptismal robes unstained by sin and by the grace of God's forgiveness, and so have the right to enter into the heavenly city. This passage of the Book of Revelation, with its prayer, Amen. Come, Lord Jesus! recalls the cry of the saints and prophets under the altar of God in the heavenly Sanctuary in Revelation 6:9-10; and, indeed, in the plea of the saints down through salvation history. It expresses our yearning for the Second Coming of Christ. But it is also a cry for the justice Christ brings as he continually "comes" in judgment throughout history.

### Gospel John 17:20-26

The gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church at Pentecost inspires us to continue establishing God's kingdom in ourselves and to share Christ with the world. At the Last Supper Jesus's prayer to the Father for the future children of the Church was for their unification as One: one Church that is One Body in Christ, just as he is One with the Father. In his discourse to his Apostles, Jesus used the Greek word for "one" (hen) to express his unity with God the Father and the unity of the Church **seven times**. Our divisions as Christians is a scandal to the world and an offence to God. In what way do we foster unity? In what do we hinder unity? Do we remain always close to Jesus, the source of our unity? Let us pray, as Jesus prayed, for the spiritual perfection of the Church through the indwelling of God the Holy Spirit.
