

THE WORD OF THE LORD

The theme of today's readings: The Gift of the Holy Spirit from the Father and the Son

First reading Acts 2:1-11 On the Feast of Pentecost God the Holy Spirit baptised and indwelled the Apostles praying with the Virgin Mary in the Upper Room in Jerusalem. He gave them the gift of the one language, the Gospel of salvation, to unite all the world's peoples. His gift removed the curse of the confusion of tongues and separation of the peoples of the earth in God's judgment at the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9). The Holy Spirit infused Jesus' disciples with new life as he sealed the new Law of a new covenant, which had been brought by Jesus the Christ and Son of God. Jesus' new Law of love is written not on stone tablets like the old Law at Mount Sinai, but on the hearts of believers.

Psalm 104 We sing in praise of God the Creator and his continual renewal of the earth and all life on it. The very breath of God's life-giving Spirit animates the renewal. In Hebrew, the word "breath" is ruah, which can mean wind, breath, air, or soul/spirit. It is the same word in Genesis 1:2, where God's Spirit/wind/breath hovered over the waters at the beginning of the Creation.

Second reading Romans 8:8-17 The New Law of the Gospel that we receive through Jesus Christ is a law of love, grace, and freedom. These three aspects that are present in the New Law were absent in the Old: It is the "law of love" because it makes us act out of the Holy Spirit's love infused into our souls. It is a "law of grace" because we receive God's grace, which gives us the strength to resist sin and grow in grace through the Sacraments. The "law of grace" is also called the "law of freedom" because it sets us free from the condemnation of the old Law of Moses and the position of a servant to raise us to the status of sons and daughters through adoption, as co-heirs with Christ.

Gospel John 14:15-16,23b-26

We must demonstrate our love for Jesus by love in action. St. John the Apostle emphasised this necessity in his First Letter to the Church: Children, our love must be not just words or mere talk, but something active and genuine. This will be the proof that we belong to the truth...This is what the love of God is, keeping his commandments (IJohn 3:18 and 5:3). Jesus promised his disciples that the Holy Spirit would help them remember what Jesus taught and give them a deeper understanding of those teachings, so that they might live them. We pray today that the same Holy Spirit will fall down upon us, and help us to keep Jesus' words by our manner of life.

DAY FOR LIFE - SUNDAY 15th JUNE Every year the Church in England, Wales, Scotland, and Ireland marks the Day for Life, as a reminder of the need to respect and protect the inherent value and dignity of each life. This year it is Sunday 15th June. On that day our parish will hold a **second collection** for the Day for Life Fund. Every year, the fund allocates over £200,000 in grants, to organisations which promote the Christian respect for life from conception to natural death, in various ways. This has made a significant impact in local communities of England and Wales by, for example, providing mothers and children with necessary means. This is not possible without your generous support to the fund. You are therefore invited to give as much as you can and encourage others to do so. You can also donate by scanning the QR code on the Day for Life 2025 poster in our church, or online via the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales website, where you will find out more on the Fund." Copies of this year's message from the Bishops about Day for Life are available at the back of church. It is entitled 'Hope does not disappoint: Finding meaning in suffering'.
