THE FIRST SUBSCRIBERS / SHAREHOLDERS

In my home country belonging to a group is very important, someone who choses to live a solitary life is likely to run into trouble. A Christian Kenyan philosopher John S. Mbiti as if moved by the Holy Spirit invented the classic phrase, "*I am, because we are; and since we are therefore I am*", a phrase which has become so well-known. It is rooted in the African philosophy of Ubuntu. It emphasizes the interconnectedness of humanity, highlighting that individuals are not independent but rather exist in a relationship of mutual interdependence. This philosophy stresses that one's humanity is realized through the humanity of others, and that collective well-being is essential for individual well-being. If you reflect on this phrase, you soon recognise how inadequate we are if we were to act as though other people do not matter. The fact is that human beings are just a tiny part of the eco-system, just as a parish community is a tiny piece of God's global saving plan.

In Israel's history no greater event brought people together more than Passover and Pentecost but their celebration was different. Passover celebrated the miraculous escape from Egypt, (Exod. 12:14,24), all adult male Israelites were obliged to attend the Passover celebrations (Exod 23:14,17). Pentecost on the other hand was a Jewish harvest festival that was celebrated fifty days after celebrating the Passover. Yahweh was known as the owner of the land, therefore once Passover was celebrated and gifts collected in from the fields, it was time to give thanks to Yahweh who had abundantly blessed the work of their hands.

Pentecost is significant in the New Testament because on that day, the Church was born or visually established. In secular terms we could say that, it was on that day the company was started or the manifesto launched.

The original subscription to Church membership had moved from the Jewish people to include the pagans to remind us that the Church is a global instrument of God's salvation, no one has ownership of the Church or has the right to act as though it were a club reserved for a few to exclude the others. When the Church was launched by God the Father through the Holy Spirit at the request of Jesus, the first subscribers came from the whole known world: Parthians, Medes, Elamites, Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, Asia, Phrygia, Pamphilia, Egyptians, Libyans, Cyreneans, Cretans, Arabs as well as visitors from Rome (Europeans). The only people who were missing were the Americans!

As a Parish with members drawn from many peoples and languages, Pentecost teaches to realise that in God's plan, monopoly of his saving grace cannot be limited to individual few but to everybody. We must trust in the transformative power of the Holy Spirit; nobody was born either as a sinner or as a saint. You might have heard me say that every saint has a history and every sinner has a future. This happens when we let the Spirit of God guide us and to set the agenda for us.

Pentecost invites us to be bold in witnessing to Christ, to cherish the importance of community, and the expectation that God's work will be both profound and sometimes surprising. As a Christian, never look at yourself as an outsider, you were represented on the day the Church was born, this is your spiritual home.
