#### TRANSLATE OUR SUNDAY MASS INTO OUR PARISH MISSION

It is an intentional greeting that our parish priest starts the Holy Mass by saying "<u>Brothers and Sisters, I welcome you to our Sunday Mass.</u>" That statement carries with it some fundamental truth, namely that when we gather to celebrate the Holy Mass we are united as brothers and sisters in the Lord. The Holy Mass is an action of Christ but it is our action too, therefore, it is right to welcome one another to an action which is indeed our own. The Holy Mass being an action of Christ, he offers it to the Father as our priest; he is the altar on which the sacrifice is offered, and he is the victim who is sacrificed for our redemption.

Active participation in Mass is a good thing in the Catholic Church and encouraged. It's about more than just physical attendance of Mass. It is about actively engaging with the liturgy and uniting oneself with Christ's sacrifice. Active participation should flow from an interior disposition to be attentive to the sacred mysteries that are celebrated, and to receive the graces that God wills to impart. When we assemble for Mass, we must be mindful that we are standing in the presence and before the majesty of God, we are not mere observers or lifeless statues, we are not deaf and dumb either, instead we are living worshippers of God to whom we raise our minds and hearts.

The Mass is concluded with a dismissal mandate of what the faithful have to do from there on. Our parish deacons decide on which one to use. Some dismissal mandates are:

The Mass is ended go in peace.

The Mass is ended go in peace to love and to serve the Lord

The Mass is ended go in peace glorifying God by your life.

The Mass is ended go and proclaim the gospel of the Lord

We must translate what we celebrate in the Sunday Mass into our parish mission. A parish is an ecclesiastical territorial division where the faithful form the living body of Christ, a pilgrim people of God, and through which they fulfil their baptismal promises. They support each other encouraging one another in the faith as fellow pilgrims of hope. The formulars which we use to conclude the Mass instruct us on what we as parishioners ought to do once we get back into our daily lives. We ought to go and live peaceful lives, do our best to love and serve our brothers and sisters. We ought to glorify God by our deeds and to proclaim the gospel to others.

Among many ways in which people of the parish support each other and proclaim the gospel to one another, is by participating in the social activities of the parish. Christians are not spiritual beings only, we are also physical and social beings. These levels have their needs which must be served as well.

I wish to thank parishioners who try as much as they can, to participate in activities outside Church worship for the building up of our parish. Tea and coffee served in the hall after Mass on Sunday deepens the social outreach proclaimed in the dismissal mandate: *The Mass is ended go in peace to love and to serve the Lord.* So what we celebrate at Mass, and what we do after Mass, must be seen as forming a single action of Christ who builds his kingdom in our individual lives and proclaims it to the world through our actions.

Let us together do our best to translate what we celebrate at Mass into our parish mission. We are gathered here to proclaim Christ to the world because we are his ambassadors.
