WE LOOKED AT SUCH MEN WITH GREAT ADMIRATION

Tuesday 24th June 2025 was a Solemnity of the birth of St. John the Baptist. Holy Mass was presided over by our new missionary parish assistant Fr. Pius Mmanda assisted by Fr. John O'Brien and Fr. Jimmy. As Fr. Pius led us in worship, I remembered the work of European Missionaries in Africa. I remembered that some years ago, Fr. John went to Africa as a missionary to proclaim Jesus Christ to the people. He worked in Kenya among the Masai people; an ethnic group bordering the Chagga people of Tanzania. Fr. Pius belongs to the Chagga people. There is great possibility that the preaching of Fr. John spilled over to them.

When Fr. John was intentionally proclaiming Christ to the Masai people, Fr. Pius was a three year old boy moving about in the church, and making noise which as you know, sometimes irritates worshippers. Fr. John was not bothered by the noise children made. They looked at the man standing at the altar and admired seeing him act with such devotion, but they could not go further. The walking about of children in church, their singing out of tune, and their talking to persons or things which did not exist was not intended to distract worshippers but a learning process. It was from an environment of familiarity that our vocation started. All of us know that we never fall in love with strangers and that intimacy never exists between estranged persons. We should not hesitate to bring children to Church or to let them walk about for fear they might make noise. They do so to learn.

Our missionary vocation started to grow in us by looking at people like Fr. John in an African setting. As children we asked ourselves; *'where does this man come from, did he leave his family to come to preach to us, does he miss his family, is he not making real sacrifice to stay among us, can I also do what he has done by going and becoming a missionary'?* These were the questions that disturbed our hearts as we grew up. Our parents challenged us to ponder on them from time to time.

Fr. Pius, celebrating Mass in the presence of a veteran priest Fr. John, who preached the gospel not far from his area, is a testimony that missionaries who go to proclaim the gospel are not dumb but true proclaimers of Jesus by word and example. We were encouraged by our families and teachers to look at the missionaries, priests and nuns, with great admiration. As the Apostles of Jesus are working in Coventry/Nuneaton deanery, are you helping your children to look at them with a sense of admiration for the work and sacrifices they have made or you are busy criticising them!

On Tuesday, I had a meeting with the Vicar General of our dioceses Canon Jonathan Veasay and I told him that the Apostles of Jesus missionaries are not in the diocese as a permanent solution to the vocation crisis. They are here to support the people of God in keeping the dimming flame alive; to navigate the turbulent times until the Lord will visit the land with vocations from your families. In the mean time, I appeal to you for support for the Apostles of Jesus, with your prayers, cooperation and financial sacrifices to assist them in the training of missionaries. You can do this by writing a cheque to *'Apostles of Jesus Missionaries Support UK'* or by giving your donation at the cash machine at the back of the church. Above all, train your entire family to be part of the solution to the problems facing the church by becoming missionaries yourselves without leaving your homes.
