THE HEART OF COMPASSION

June is the month for the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We renew our devotion to Jesus who revealed God's mercy for all peoples. He invites us to emulate his heart by showing compassion upon people in our world who are disadvantaged. As usual, the call for compassion is urgently needed today. A brief view of our present-day world reveals disturbing and confusing incidents, some of which are being championed by world leaders and heads of Government. Some of those are involved in manufacturing and trading in deadly weapons that fuel the intractable wars.

It is possible to focus on the more dramatic bombardments in the wars taking place in Palestine between Israel and Hamas, and the current attack on the innocent people that is now being interpreted as a genocide. Other intractable wars include those between Russia and Ukraine, war lords in the Sudan, conflicts in South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Focusing on these may make one overlook what could be happening in our closest neighbourhoods and families.

The disadvantaged people who are subject to misery because they are trapped in sufferings imposed on them by others must be the subject of our compassion. The challenges facing humanity, both near and far, call for active compassion: an ideal beautifully represented by the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Pope Francis wrote, 'Love for our brothers and sisters is not simply the fruit of our own efforts; it demands the transformation of our selfish hearts. This realization gave rise to the oft-repeated prayer: "Jesus, make our hearts more like your own" (Dilexit Nos, No.168) . The virtue of compassion is founded on our common humanity whose Golden Rule is: 'So, in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you' (Matthew 7:12).

With compassion goes the determination to intervene and render service to the community to make other people's lives better. The special vocations to the sacred priest-hood and consecrated life are motivated by that zeal to reach out to the world with a heart of compassion. In summary, compassion is founded on the realisation of the need to care for people in need. The Sacred Heart of Jesus provides us with the live example of such generous self-giving.
