# **CORPUS ET SANGUIS CHRISTI**

"Lord, teach us to pray the Holy Mass"

I find Luke 11:1 an inspirational challenge and an invitation to examine my approach to prayer. I am inviting you, my dear readers, to meditate with me. As Luke narrates, the disciples saw Jesus praying and one of them asked, "Lord, teach us how to pray." Our Lord taught them how to pray, and hopefully they learnt. They asked for lessons in prayer because they realised that their ways of prayer were deficient. Our Lord had a superior method and approach to prayer.

Today, as we celebrate the solemnity of *Corpus and Sanguis Christi*, I ask a question: How do you celebrate the Holy Mass? It is okay to acknowledge that your approaches and methods of prayer at the Holy Mass are deficient. Should you therefore not ask the Lord to teach you how to pray the Holy Mass?

Let us together ask the Lord to teach us how to pray in the Holy Mass—to recognize Him in the ordained priest, the minister of the Eucharist. Let us ask the Lord to help us discern His presence in the Word proclaimed during the Mass, and above all, to recognize Him in the most majestic Sacrament of His real presence in the Consecrated Host and Wine—His Sacred Body and Blood.

It is important to prepare for the Holy Mass while at home, along the way and when you enter the church, and to be filled with reverence in the Lord's presence in this holy place. Lord, teach us how to pray.

One important lesson that the Lord teaches us is our common priesthood, through the Sacrament of Baptism. You are invited to be aware of, and to exercise, that priesthood in the Holy Mass. By your active participation and a sense of co-responsibility in the Mass by your responses, singing, offering prayers of thanksgiving and petition being aware that it is our Holy Mass. In the Holy Mass we draw new life and energy for our mission in the world.

At the commission, 'Go the Mass is ended,' you are sent to go out to witness to what you receive in the Holy Mass. Lord teach us to pray the Holy Mass; Lord, teach me how to pray the Holy Mass. Amen.
