## Welcome to Mass today. We extend a special welcome to anybody joining us for the first time. Please introduce yourself, and if you are able, stay for refreshments after the Mass.

Today's Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, along with Corpus Christi next Sunday, isn't a celebration of an event such as Christmas or Easter, but of a doctrine – that God has revealed himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit – One God in three Persons. God is mystery, an immense mystery our minds struggle to grasp. And yet, through grace, we can live the truth of this mystery in our worship. The Spirit of God draws us to the altar where Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God, draws us to the Father through the sacrifice of the Cross sacramentally offered in the way that he has commanded.

Today's readings from Proverbs, Romans, and John are all about "pouring out." God pours Self out in Word; God and Word pour out the Spirit to help us pour ourselves out; and the Spirit pours forth Faith and strength and character. Instead of spelling out the doctrine of Holy Trinity, today's readings summarize the effects of the Trinity in our daily lives.

The Book of Proverbs reflects on Wisdom, a quality which that book identifies with God. St Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, teaches us that we have peace with God the Father through Jesus Christ, and that the love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, Jesus, the Son of God, mentions the role of the Holy Spirit, His close relationship with God the Father and what the Holy Spirit is going to do for us as we go about our daily tasks. God has revealed to us three separate functions that are carried out by the three Persons. He has told us that it is proper to attribute to God the Father the work of creation; to God the Son, the work of Redemption, of reconciliation and of healing, and to the Holy Spirit, the work of guidance in truth, in the work of teaching and in the work of sanctification.

Living a life in the Holy Trinity as a Catholic involves striving to live a life of love and unity, inspired by the relationship between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This includes actively seeking to love God and others, fostering unity within the Church, and living a life that reflects the Trinity's divine nature. As Catholics, we are encouraged to live a life that reflects the teachings of Jesus, who showed us how to live a life of love and service.

SECOND COLLECTION: Day for Life

**DAY FOR LIFE** is the day in the Church's year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. This year it will be marked on Sunday 15 June. The theme is 'Hope does not Disappoint: Finding meaning in Suffering.' It is inspired by Romans 5:5-6. St Paul invites us to see that Christian hope is not just naïve optimism but, rather, an unshakeable trust in the power and presence of God who is with us always. This hope can endure the darkness of human suffering and even see beyond it. Suffering touches every person at some point in their lives. It is often associated with illness, grief, and loss. It is not only caused by physical pain but includes emotional suffering as well as 'soul pain', such as depression and despair. Christians are not immune to this mystery, and we often struggle to know how best to respond to it, and where we can find hope.

Day for Life is an invitation to pray for those who suffer and to remain with them like the Good Samaritan, bearing witness to their unique and unrepeatable value. We see this closeness in the generous and fruitful service of healthcare professionals, whose mission continues even when there is no longer any prospect of physical healing. We see it in another way in families, carers and chaplains who support their brothers and sisters who are sick or frail or struggling with the many burdens of life. As Christians, we affirm them and hold out to them the hope of Jesus Christ who does not disappoint us.

**FATHER'S DAY:** As we celebrate Father's Day this Sunday, we pray for all those who have chosen the vocation of the father of a family or those who exercise a fatherly role in the care of others. May their desire to fulfil their calling well be sustained by keeping always before them the all-merciful Heavenly Father, and images such as the Father of the Prodigal Son.

**TODAY** we welcome Sue Nightingale to our Masses who will be speaking about the work and mission of Mary's Meals, the charity that we are supporting this year. Later in the year we plan to have a retiring collection to add to the money which has already been raised through refreshments after Mass.

**'BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD!'** Many of us enjoy coming to church for a number of reasons. Not only do we get a chance to be closer to God, but we also get to see some of our friends, people that we have known perhaps for a long time, which gives us a chance to catch up on what is going on in each other's lives. Today's world is starved of silence and Holy Mass should be a privileged moment to escape the hustle and bustle of daily life and, through worship and participation in Christ's eternal sacrifice, become capable of giving an eternal value to these same daily and transitory activities.

Before Mass there should be a general atmosphere of silence. This does not exclude a quiet word of greeting, a nod of recognition or a friendly handshake among the parishioners. What should be avoided is the steadily rising hum of multiple conversations in the pews, often interrupted only by the announcement that the celebration is about to begin.

Pope Francis frequently emphasised the importance of silence, particularly before Mass, as a way to prepare the heart and mind for prayer and deeper listening to God's word. He highlighted silence as a space where one can make room for Christ and discern the Father's will, leading to more authentic communication with God.

#### **FIRST READING**

Proverbs 8:22-31

Thus says the Wisdom of God: The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths, I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the children of man.
